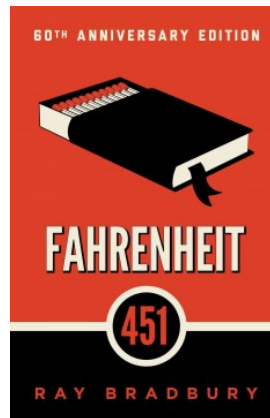
Find Out What's New!

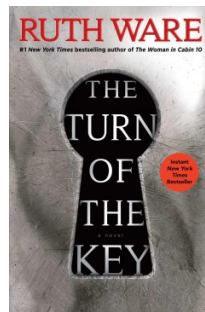
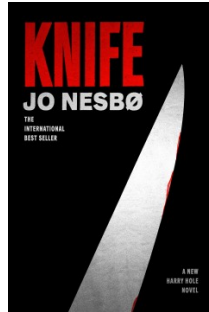
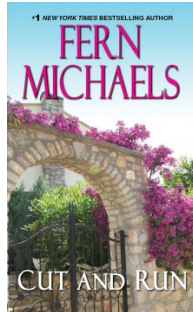
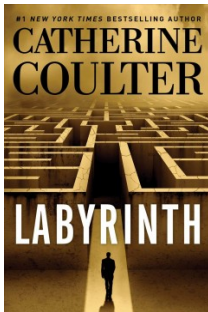
The Inn by James Patterson

Grant Approved for Preserving Our Past Project

We are proud to announce that the library has received a grant from the Benton Community Fund of the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin, Inc. to support the *Preserving Our Past Project: Wisconsin Newspaper Archive*.

Within the next year, patrons will have online access to the full catalog of Benton's historical newspapers. 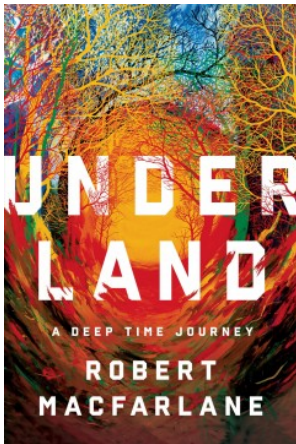
New Library as part of a Community Center

Along with FEH Design and the Core Planning Committee, the library will provide any new information on future developments. We will keep you posted on what is pushing Benton forward.

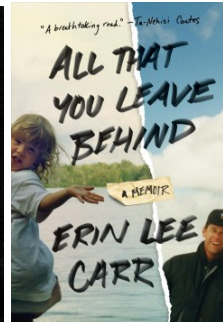
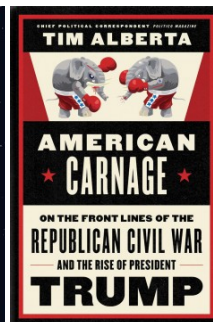
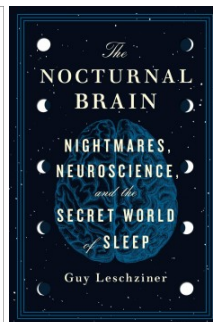
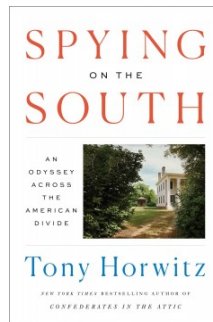
