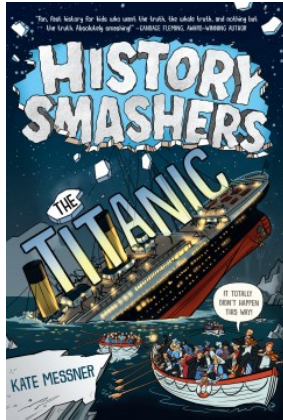


Anne Frank : witness to history!

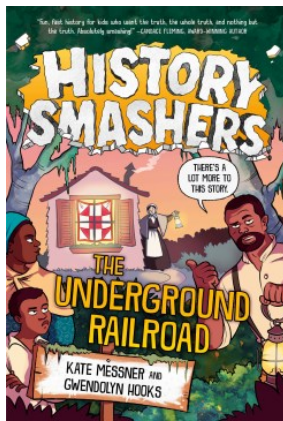
educational and inspiring read for those who enjoy history and graphic novels"

by Kate Messner

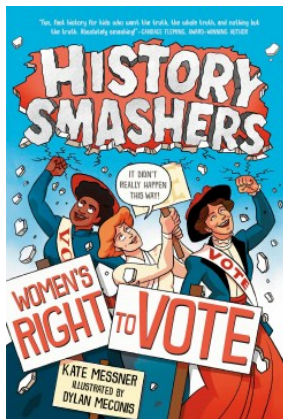
