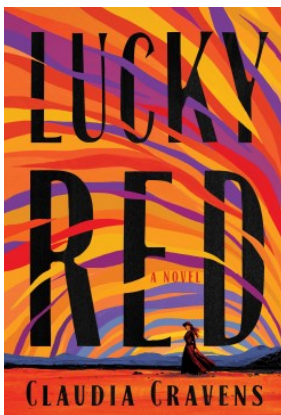

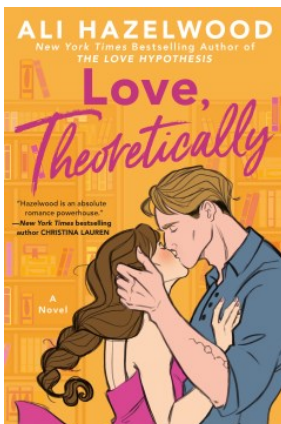

by Claudia Cravens

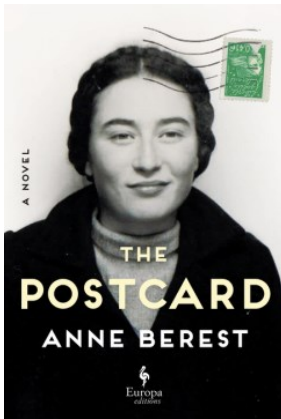

by Anne Berest

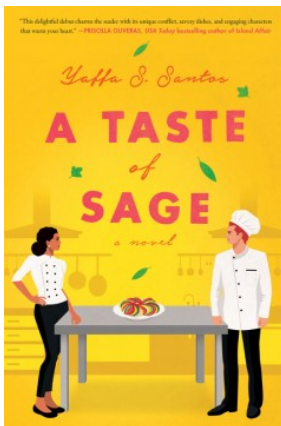

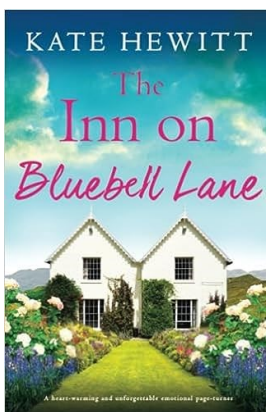

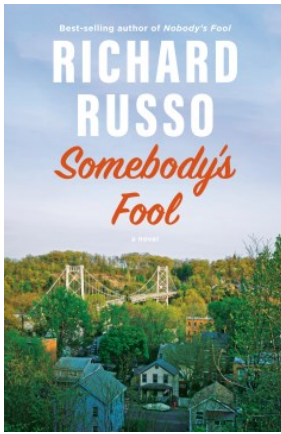

by Richard Russo

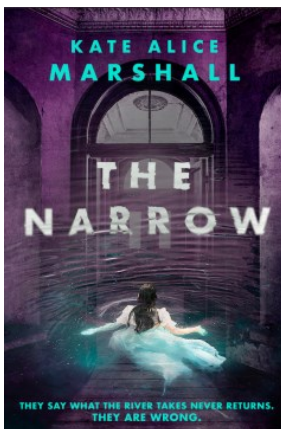

by Carolyn Brown

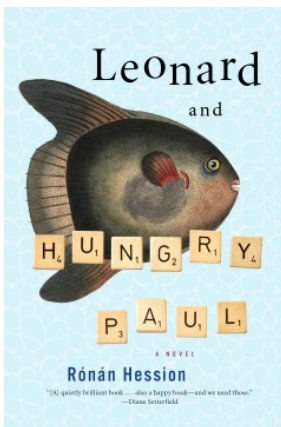

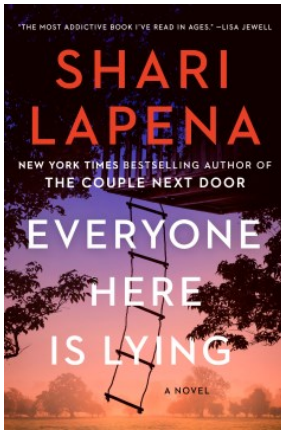


## *Leonard and Hungry Paul : a novel*

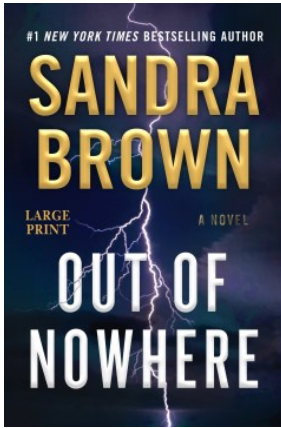




## *Everyone Here Is Lying*

by Shari Lapena

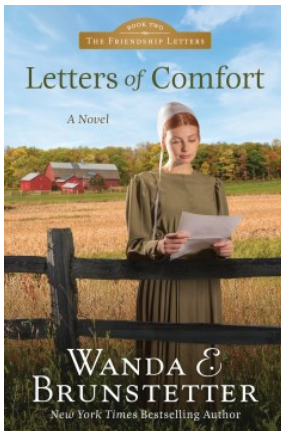

by Sandra Brown

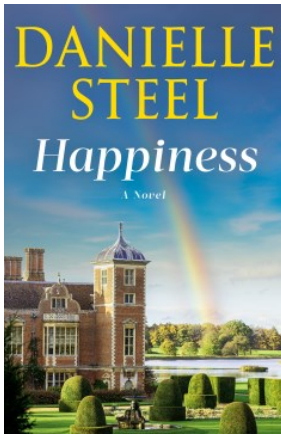
The lives of a young mother and a high-rolling consultant collide under devastating circumstances—culminating in a desperate manhunt that will change their futures forever.

by Wanda E. Brunstetter

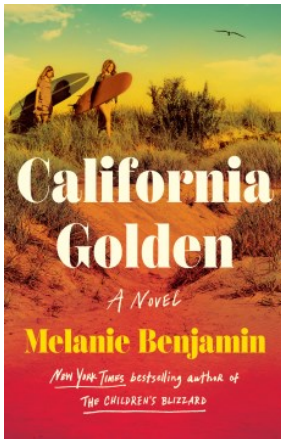

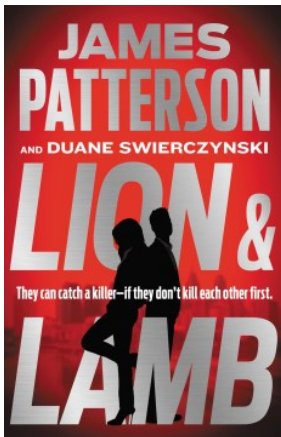

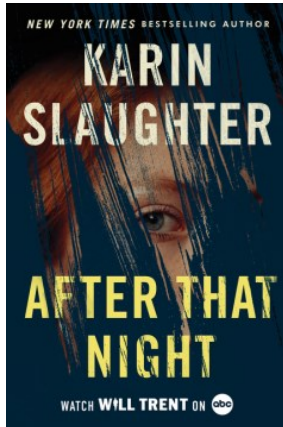
## *Rock Bottom - August 22*
